Project: Economic Impact of Fusarium Head Blight in Wheat and Barley

1. What major problem or issue is being resolved and how are you resolving it?

The major problem that is being addressed in this project is to estimate the economic losses caused by Fusarium Head Blight (for 1991-1999) for U.S. wheat and barley producers. The problem is being resolved by estimating yield losses and quality-related price discounts by states and by region. Secondary impacts in wheat and barley producing states will also be considered.

2. Please provide a comparison of the actual accomplishments with the objectives established.

We are in the final two months of the data collection process. All relevant models that will be used for the analysis are currently being developed and will be completed by the end of October. The full time graduate student on the project and a web page designer have began work to develop a web page for the economic impact of FHB on wheat and barley in the U.S. We are on target with our actual accomplishments and the objective established.
