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Project 1: Accelerate development of resistant varieties.

1. What major problem or issue is being resolved and how are you resolving it?

Currently, resistance sources for wheat scab or Fusarium head blight are in material (Chinese lines) which is not adapted to the Southeastern U.S. for yield potential or milling and baking quality. We have made crosses of varieties and lines adapted to the Southeast with the Chinese lines. These lines are been backcrossed as well as advanced to the next generation in both a summer nursery and greenhouse.

2. Please provide a comparison of the actual accomplishments with the objectives established.

A protocol for screening lines to scab in the lower Southeast was initiated to evaluate the possibility of screening materials in the field under artificial inoculum. We were able to evaluate material in the field. We have also made several single and three way crosses with resistant sources which will be advanced this fall.

3. What were the reasons established objectives were not met? If applicable.

4. What were the most significant accomplishments this past year?

The most significant accomplishment was that evaluation of material could be successfully conducted in the lower Southeast under warm climatic conditions. This could facilitate the early screening of material during the year from the mid-western states.
